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






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Crossing Europe 2019 - COMPACT

For the 16th time the CROSSING EUROPE Film Festival in Linz dedicates itself to **presenting ambitious European filmmaking in an accessible manner** in Linz, and offers a direct exchange with attending filmmakers from all over the European continent. For six days the inner city of Linz with its long-established festival district surrounding the Upper Austrian Culture Quarter and the festival cinemas Moviemento and City-Kino will become the **pulsating heart** of the festival.

From **April 25 to 30** CROSSING EUROPE – Austria's third biggest film festival after the Viennale and the Diagonale – will take audiences on a virtual journey all across Europe. For a week you can discover **149 hand-picked feature films and documentaries** from **48** different countries, delve into sociopolitical, but also artistically eccentric works, as well as explore highlights of the current festival season and local filmmaking.

For film discussion, talks and Masterclasses 140 film guests from all over Europe have announced their attendance. Crossover projects on the intersection of film and media art, the YAAAS! Youth Program consisting of workshops and screenings, as well as the nightline with current musical acts on six evening completes the line-up. The Best-of Crossing Europe on May 1 marks the end of this year's festival week where you will be able to see award winners and audience favorites one more time. After the festival, in May and June, there will be a chance to see selected works on the silver screen in Vienna, Dornbirn, Wels and Linz once more.

Apart from the **four competition sections** (Competition Fiction, Competition Documentary, Competition Local Artists and – for the first time this year – YAAAS! Competition), there will also be the established program strands **Working Worlds** ("Independent Women"), **European Panorama Fiction & Documentary** (highlights from the current festival season) and **Night Sight** (once again dedicated to "fantastic" film). Furthermore there will be the program **Architecture & Society** ("Space, Time, History") and for the fifth time in 2019 **Cinema Next Europe** ("The Family Issue"). Also not be overlooked is this year's **Tribute** (Jaime Rosales, ES) – a program that is dedicated every year to an innovative European filmmaker, whose complete works are shown for the first time in Austria within the festival framework – and the **Spotlight** with a focus on the works of a selected European film personality (Iris Elezi, AL). The **YAAAS! Youth Program** intends to establish a holistic program for film education, acquisition of media competencies, and DIY-video production.

Despite having been successful at international film festivals, the majority of the productions in the program rarely find their way into regular cinema programs. That is why CROSSING EUROPE is dedicated to creating a platform for new positions and developments in European filmmaking, to have discussions with a broad audience about these films, and also to honor them. In the aforementioned four competition sections, four international juries will select the winners of money and material prizes that together make up 30,000 €.

Ten years after the successful cultural year "Linz 2009 – Cultural Capital of Europe", and one month before the coming European elections festival director Christine Dollhofer and her team remain true to their credo: the CROSSING EUROPE program must do justice to the variety of Europe, and open a **differentiated point of view on the state of Europe** to an interested audience – with cinematographic positions that offer an optimistic and forward thinking image of Europe that is open to world and intends to spark an interest in European contemporary cinema. Onward toward Europe!

Onward toward Europe!

Especially in 2019, Europe is a hot topic for everyone – in Linz due to the tenth anniversary of the successful "Linz 2009 – Cultural Capital of Europe", and all over the continent the European parliamentary elections will take place in Mai. Adding to that, the possibility of Brexit, separatist tendencies, migration, nationalist and right-wing populist aggravation as well as sociopolitical condemnation and social injustices keep Europe in the headlines, and make it harder to find universal enthusiasm for a united Europe.

For the 16th time CROSSING EUROPE has made it its mission to work against these tendencies, and puts the programmatic focus on the European continent for the film festival in Linz. As a declared pro-European cultural event, the festival intends to open up a differentiated point of view on contemporary Europe with a hand-picked selection of 149 feature films and documentaries, and celebrate European film culture for a week.

This year's festival program presents itself as **lively, creative, open, multi-lingual, critical,** and **diverse,** and will take audiences on a virtual trip through Europe, from Iceland all across the continent to the Black Sea. We are joined on that journey by many previous CROSSING EUROPE guests and award winners who return to Linz with their current works – many central films of this year's edition were created by directors who have been connected to the festival for fifteen years, and thereby also helped shape it, among those are i.e. Joanna Hogg (Tribute guest 2014), Thomas Heise (had a special showing in 2006), this year's Tribute guest Jaime Rosales (whose first feature film THE HOURS OF THE DAY could be seen in the competition section of the very first edition of CROSSING EUROPE) or award winners on the European level, such as Teona Strugar Mitevska (the closing film will be a work by her), Carlos Marques-Marcet, Vitaly Mansky, and from the Local Artists section directors such as Edith Stauber (a Special is dedicated to her this year); Rainer Kohlberger, Siegfried A. Fruhauf, and Leni Gruber (the director of this year's CROSSING EUROPE festival trailer BRACE FOR IMPACT)

In the area of film and media education CROSSING EUROPE is taking new paths – in comparison to the past. The YAAAS! Youth Program wants to directly speak to the cinema audiences of tomorrow. The various YAAAS! modules were designed for people between the ages of 15 and 20, and include practical workshops, a video-project that lasts multiple days, a presentation, a "speed-dating" with industry professionals, and with the YAAAS! Competition that was curated by a group of youths – the YAAAS! Young Programmers – CROSSING EUROPE now has a fourth competition section. The YAAAS! Youth Jury will award one of the six competition films in this section.

We are also happy to announce the expansion of the so-called "Nachspiele" or "Follow-Up"-screenings, a number of films from this year's festival edition will be shown on the silver screen again in May and June: i.e. in the Programmkino Wels, the Spielboden Dornbirn, as the AK-film of the month in the Moviemento Linz, and in Vienna in the Filmcasino (at /slasheinhalb), Votiv Kino (Best-of CROSSING EUROPE on seven evenings), Stadtkino (in the context of the series "Crisis? What Crisis?"), and in the Bickle Kino/Belvedere 21 – which expands the cinephile journey of the sixteenth edition of CROSSING EUROPE all over the European cinematic continent by a number of stations. In this sense: onward toward a diverse European cinematic universe!

Fact & Figures

Within the official program all together **149** selected feature and short films, and documentaries from **48** different countries – of which **108** are premieres (**21** world premieres, **1** international premiere, and **86** Austrian premieres – await the international festival guests and local cinema audiences. Of these – wholly in keeping with balanced gender equality programming – slightly more than half (50,3%), specifically 75 works, were (co-)directed by women.

The festival year 2019 – the sixteenth edition of the festival – consists of 184 program positions and 22

accompanying programs. All in all, 23 productions will be shown during the Follow-Up screening in May and June. Around 700 national and international accredited film, press, and industry guests are expected to attend CROSSING EUROPE 2019, consisting of many film students as well as 140 film guests.

In 2019, we will award money and material prizes in the worth of 30,000 € in the four competition sections during the award ceremony on April 29.

Financial Situation

Over the past few years, we were always able to describe the financial situation of the festival as stable, but always with the addition "precarious". The festival director Christine Dollhofer called for an expansion of the financial means, and we are happy to announce that this year that call was answered in part. This means that CROSSING EUROPE 2019 can count on expanded support from our long standing funders (the city of Linz, the federal state of Upper Austria, federal ministry for the EU, the Arts and Culture Division of the Federal Chancellery of Austria, Austrian Film Institute, CREATIVE EUROPE, VdFS and FAMA, among others), and our event and sponsoring partners (i.e. Upper Austrian Culture Quarter, Moviemento/City-Kino, the Trumer private brewery, and the Linz AG) have remained loyal to us. Additionally the Bank Austria could be won as a bank sponsor once again in 2019.

In comparison to last year, there has been a **10% increase in the budget**, these 10% consist of almost 7% from cultural funding pools from the city of Linz and the federal state of Upper Austria, while the remaining 3% are accounted for by other funders, sponsors, and partners. These funds were used for highly necessary investments (the keyword being digitization), steadily increasing structural costs, and the additional program for the new addition of the YAAAS! Youth Program.

CROSSING EUROPE can therefore look forward to the new festival season slightly more optimistically with a **reasonably sound financial base**, which speaks for a **strong cinematic year**, that will surely be a great gain for the festival as a forum for socio-politically conscience, artistically eccentric film making, and will provide an inspiring time for the audiences in the cinemas in Linz.

However, it is important to remark at this point that in the mid-term a valorization of funding is urgently necessary, as yearly rising costs becomes noticeable in all organizational units, and the standards of a cultural event on this scale in regard to the compensation expected by project partners, as well as by the audience are also constantly on the rise.

Thanks to Our Partners

This year CROSSING EUROPE can count on the support from 90 different funding bodies and cooperation partners. The festival must thank its **main sponsors** (the city of Linz, the federal state of Upper Austria, federal ministry for the EU, the Arts and Culture Division of the Federal Chancellery of Austria, ÖFI-Austrian Film Institute, and CREATIVE EUROPE).

From the beginning on, one particular aspect of the success of the festival has always been the spacial proximity of the **festival venues** in the inner city in Linz. Again in 2019, the majority of the events of the festival – screenings, talks, nightline, installation and exhibition – will take place in the familiar festival region within the **Upper Austrian Culture Quarter**: at the **OK Offenes Kulturhaus, Moviemento, City-Kino, Kapu** and the **Ursulinensaal**. That is why we must especially thank the two most important event partners and their teams: Wolfgang Steininger (manager of the program cinemas Moviemento & City-Kino) and Martin Sturm (artistic director of the Upper Austrian Culture Quarter). Additionally the DEEP SPACE 8K at the Ars Electronica Center in Linz will host the screening of the short film program DEEP SPACE

EXPERIMENTAL once again this year. For the first time this year, there will be a collaboration with the ELIA – solarCity Linz, that will show the Edith Stauber Special (Local Artists).

The **Upper Austrian Culture Quarter** – not only as the festival center, but also as an exhibition space in the OK – will once again not only play a part spatially, but also on a topical level. On the one hand with the **solo exhibition STANDING**, **WAITING** (2007/2019), with works by Elfie Semotan, on the occasion of the screening of the preview of the documentary ELFIE SEMOTAN, PHOTOGRAPHER (AT 2019). On the other with the kulturtankstelle, the coop laboratory of the Upper Austrian Culture Quarter with the Art university in Linz, that will host an event for the second time – the installation by Ton Matton transforms the former gas station into a **URBANE STREUOBSTWIESE**.

Next to its **media sponsors**, i.e. Der Standard, Ö1 and OÖNachrichten, the festival also wishes to thank its **long-standing sponsors** such as the Trumer private brewery, the Linz AG, who make the festival stand out every year with the CROSSING EUROPE streetcar, the Fa. Europack, who will host the GOLDEN BAG Contest for the sixth time this year in the inner city of Linz with more than 40 participating stores, in collaboration with the OÖNachrichten and the Casino Linz. We are happy to announce that the Bank Austria could once again be won as a bank sponsor.

At this point it is also important to mention the fruitful collaboration with the **embassies and cultural institutions** as well as the "film promotion agencies" that not only support the festival financially, but also contribute on a topical level – representative for a great number of partnerships a special thanks goes out to the RKI – Romanian Cultural Institute Vienna, the Slovenian Cultural Information Center Skica, the Embassy of the Kingdom of Denmark, the Polish Institute Vienna, and the Swiss Embassy Vienna, as well as German Films, the Eye Film Institute Netherlands, and the Institute Roman Llull in the context of this year's tribute that is dedicated to the Catalan director Jaime Rosales. On a European level we must also thank our festival partners from the network "MIOB – Moving Images – Open Borders" (see page 31), as well as the Institute of Documentary Film Prague for the East Silver Selection (see page 31), and the label Eye on Films for the continuation of their cooperation (see page 31).

Another pillar of the success of past editions is the thriving and long-term connection to numerous local, national, and international culture and film institutions. From the beginning onward it was important for CROSSING EUROPE to have partnerships with connecting factors. In this regard, we must mention multiple co-operations that will continue in 2019, as well as a number of new collaborations. The cooperation with the CREATIVE REGION Linz & Upper Austria was continued, who once again this year give out the award CREATIVE REGION MUSIC VIDEO. Also the collaboration with the CREATIVE EUROPE DESK AUSTRIA – CULTURE and the Interreg project "Kulturplattform Donauraum" is continued, for the sixth time this year a focus will be placed on cinematic works from countries along the Danube all the way to the region of the Black Sea under the label "Crossing X Danube" (see page 30).

The **program strand** *Cinema Next Europe*, that focuses on young European filmmakers was established in 2015, and will again be a part of the program in 2019, once again in cooperation with the newcomer initiative "CINEMA NEXT – Young Film from Austria", and sees its role as a platform for exchange and networking. The *Cinema Next Europe Club* expands this cooperation by a three-day practical module for interested young filmmakers (with support by the VdFS). Also the **co-operations** with the chamber of labor OÖ/Kultur (special *Worlds of Work*), the afo architekturforum oberösterreich (special *Architecture* & *Society*), and the Kepler Salon will continue, as well as with the OÖKB – Upper Austrian Association of Composers, the ÖKB – Austrian Association of Composers, and the department of culture of the federal state of Upper Austria in the context of the presentation of the winning project for the *PICTURE your SOUND your PICTURE-atelier award*, that was awarded to Gloria Gammer and Haydee Jimenez in 2018. Additionally the Art University Linz/Time-Based Media supports the **CROSSING EUROPE talk** & **discussion events**. Next to the Art uUniversity Linz, the Bauhaus University Weimar, the Institute for Theater, Film, and Media Studies at the University of Vienna, the FH Kufstein, the Hochschule Hannover, the Catholic Private University Linz and the Academy of Fine Arts Vienna are once again **university partners** of the festival, with around 120 students attending the festival. We are happy to announce that

the discussion format "kontroversiell" by dok.at will once again be part of the discussion program at CROSSING EUROPE. For the **third time** this year there will be the following project co-operations: the CROSSING EUROPE film collection on the Austrian VoD platform flimmit.com (see page 31), and the film discourse program *Trouble Features* (in cooperation with diskollektiv).

The collaborations with the Austrian Film Museum that took place at irregular intervals throughout the past years will once again take place this year in the context of the SPOTLIGHT 2019 – Iris Elezi. This will include the screening of a historic film program of Albanian films never shown before in Austria (see page 21). In contrast to this, the newly developed program YAAAS! Youth Program looks toward the future. The program aimed at 15 to 20-year-olds will take place at CROSSING EUROPE for the first time his year. In collaboration with the educator and artist Robert Hinterleitner and the HBLA for Artistic Design Linz, this program for film education, the acquisition of media competencies, and DIY-video production was developed. In the framework of this program, the YAAAS! Young Programmers and the YAAAS! Youth Jury will incorporate young interested people in the festival.

CROSSING EUROPE intends not only to present a young generation of directors from Europe to a broader audience, but also to honor their work with **money and material prizes**. Next to the larger funders, the City of Linz and the federal state of Upper Austria, the gfk-society for cultural politics Upper Austria will provide the funds for the Social Awareness Award in the section *European Documentary* (the winning film will be shown again on June 4 at the Central Linz), as well as the Upper Austrian Culture Quarter for Innovative Award in the section *Local Artists*. The material prize in the section Local Artists has been provided by THE GRAND POST-Audio & Picture Post Production since 2016. On this occasion we want to express our sincerest thanks for the long-standing support in achieving our goals! (see page 33).

Over the days and weeks following CROSSING EUROPE there will be a chance to see a few selected films from the festival program a second time on the silver screen: already on May 1 the "Best-of CROSSING EUROPE" at the City-Kino will show highlights and award winning films, in Vienna at the *Islasheinhalb* at the Filmcasino, and a selection from the section Spotlight can be seen at the *Xhanfise Keko program* at the Austrian film museum, in the Votiv Kino (*Best-of CROSSING EUROPE* over the course of seven evenings), Stadtkino Wien (within the series "*Crisis? What Crisis?*") and at the Blickle Kino/Belvedere 21, as well as in Wels in the *Programmkino* in the MedienKulturHaus. Additionally a selection of CROSSING EUROPE films will also be shown in the *Spielboden Dornbirn*, and a film from the section Working Worlds will be nominated for the AK-Film of the Month in Linz in May.

Finally, we wish to thank over 2300 filmmakers who have trusted us with their films since 2004, and provide the artistic DNA of CROSSING EUROPE from the bottom of our hearts. Thank you!

Festival Opening

This year the festival will already begin in the morning of the day of the opening (April 25) with **films from** all program sections, in the evening CROSSING EUROPE will then ceremoniously open with **five selected** premieres, which stand representative for the festival program and the program sections.

The Upper Austrian Culture Quarter will present the **solo exhibition** STANDING, WAITING (2007/2019) with works by the photographer Elfie Semotan on the occasion of the preview of the documentary ELFIE SEMOTAN, PHOTOGRAPHER (AT 2019, directed by Joerg Burger).

The **Nightline** starts at 10 pm on the OK Deck with **Catnapp** (AR/DE) and DJ **Anna Leiser** (AT), admission is free.

Opening Films 2019

As is tradition, CROSSING EUROPE will open with **multiple films** this year that stand for the **great variety of contemporary European cinema**, and also offer a cross section of this year's program.

The openings on April 25 are spearheaded by the Berlinale award winner (SYSTEMSPRENGER), will show a radicalized Denmark shaken by dystopia and political unrest (DANMARKS SØNNER), will be dedicated to the Upper Austrian photographer Elfie Semotan (ELFIE SEMOTAN, PHOTOGRAPHER – Preview), and will show two women fighting for their right to their own story and personal good fortune (PETRA and BOTA). A number of quests have already announced their attendance – see film list below.

SYSTEMSPRENGER / SYSTEM CRASHER (DE 2019) - Austrian premiere

At an age of nine Benni has already experienced a lot. Her hyper-activity paired with a not so negligible propensity for violence hopelessly overburdens her mother, while constantly changing foster parents, child psychologists, and anti-aggression training does the rest. Despite eager social workers there is still the danger that Benni falls through the net of youth welfare. – Nora Fingscheidt's film debut is an intense drama about a girl who does not seem to fit into the system, yet only yearns – as would be expected at that age – for safety and love.

BOTA is the first feature film by this year's Spotlight guest Iris Elezi. The visually striking production celebrated its Austrian premiere at the CROSSING EUROPE 2015. - The terror of the communist regime in Albania continues to have an effect to date, people yearn for economic and political stability. As do the two sisters in the film, who take their fate into their own hands on a lonesome tract of land.

Closing Film, 30 April: GOD EXISTS, HER NAME IS PETRUNYA

CROSSING EUROPE has been connected to the Macedonian **director Teona Strugar Mitevska** since the very beginning. At the very first edition of the festival in 2004, her feature film debut <u>KAKO UBIV SVETEC</u> <u>/HOW I KILLED A SAINT</u> (MZ/SI/FR 2004) was awarded the CROSSING EUROPE Award – Competition fiction. Ever since then, all her films have been presented in Linz as Austrian premiers. For this reason, we are very happy to announce that her new feature film, which had its world premiere at the **Berlinale** and was awarded with two awards (Prize of the Ecumenical Jury and the Gilde film prize) will be this year's closing film.

The protagonist of the feminist satire puts herself above religious and societal traditions by taking part in a ritual reserved only for men on a whim. This "scandal" does not only cause excitement within the village and the media, but is also the start of a successful process of empowerment.

Program Sections and Films in Detail

COMPETITION FICTION

This year the section consists of **eleven Austrian premieres** that demonstrate a broad spectrum both thematically and formally. In the selection feature film the audience will see young people searching for a place in society (LIGHT AS FEATHERS, DAS MELANCHOLISCHE MÄDCHEN), how marriages, or relationships become battlefields (MONSTRI., ORAY; TECHELOVEK KOTORIJ UDIVIL VSEH), the effects of structural change and gentrification (BAIT, SAF), women in emotional states of emergency (FUGA, IRINA,

DER UNSCHULDIGE), as well as how political instability breaks down community over time (VULKAN). **Four** of the directors of the selected film have been **previous guests** of CROSSING EUROPE: Agnieszka Smoczyńska (2016: The Lure), Nadejda Koseva (2005: Lost and Found, and 2016: as the producer of JAJDA), Simon Jaquemet (2015: CHRIEG), and Roman Bondarchuk (2016: UKRAINIAN SHERIFFS).

YAAAS! YOUTH PROGRAM

To call out YAAAS! means to euphorically say "YES! - "YES!" to a new program at CROSSING EUROPE that is aimed specifically at **young audiences**. The YAAAS! Youth Program that was developed and is executed by Robert Hinterleitner together with the CROSSING EUROPE team, intends to establish a holistic program for **film education**, **acquisition of media competencies**, **and DIY-video production**. YAAAS! is aimed at **15 to 20-year-olds**, who will get the chance to engage with international media professionals, learn new skills, see and discuss films, as well as present their own works. Next to **film screenings**, a **youth jury** and a **video project that spans multiple days**, YAAAS! is dedicated to the maxim of "actively doing rather than passively listening and watching, realizing their own works and putting them up for discussion" and sees itself as complementing media education in secondary school. Specifically it is about promoting media competency through practical work with the medium of film and its reception.

YAAAS! Young Programmers

Five youths (see above), who all attend the HBLA for Artistic Design in Linz, were invited to select six films for the competition section YAAAS! Competition. Additionally they will carry out the introductions and Q&A sessions at the YAAAS! film screenings and will look after the workshop participants.

YAAAS! Competition & Youth Jury

The competition films were nominated by the YAAAS! Young Programmers and will be judged by the YAAAS! Youth Jury (see page 34), who will select their favorite and award it with the YAAAS! Youth Jury Award, endowed with 2000 €. Three of the films will be shown additionally in special school screenings.

YAAAS! Workshoprally & YAAAS! Video-Project

The YAAAS! Workshoprally offers the possibility of furthering skills in various fields (e.g. camera, acting, props, sound, lighting). In the framework of the YAAAS! Video-project, teams of six to eight youths will produce their own cinematic contributions over six days.

YAAAS! Events

At the YAAAS! Face-To-Face youths can meet national and international industry professionals in the style of speed dating and explore different occupations within the film industry. The final presentation of the YAAAS! Video-Project is designed as an open forum for feedback and exchange of experiences.

The audience is not my friend, in a way it is my enemy that does not forgive me if I make something that it does not like, after all the people have sacrificed some of their time and spent money to see the film.

Jaime Rosales was born in 1970 in **Barcelona** and studied at the prestigious San Antonio de los Baños International Film and Television School (EICTV) in Cuba. After that, he went to Australia, where he continued his studies at the Australian Film Television and Radio School Broadcasting Entertainment (AFTRSBE). He then returned to Europe and began to work for television as a screen writer and founded his **own production company** Fresdeval Films in 2001.

Already his first feature film (LAS HORAS DEL DÍA) was highly successful internationally and had its world premiere – as with four other of his films – at the international film festival in Cannes. He has become one of the most important voices in Spanish contemporary cinema, and seems to re-invent himself in every one of his films. No film is like the last, and yet every one of his six feature films bares his artistic handwriting. What is particularly impressive is his joy of experimentation as well as the consistency with which Rosales realizes his cinematographic vision every time. Sometimes he experiments with technical "gimmicks" (e.g. the use of split-screens in LA SOLEDAD, or what was still considered to be new media at the time, e.g. Skype

in HERMOSA JUVENTUD), other times, the stringent camera work leaves a lasting impression. Think of the terror-drama TIRO EN LA CABEZA, where the camera is never close to the action, but rather watches everything from afar, much like in a nature documentary (Rosales himself made this comparison in an interview).

It also becomes apparent in his current production PETRA that the excessive use of pans with the steady cam was chosen explicitly as a stylistic device. Rosales works both with professional actors as well as with amateurs. Sometimes he does entirely without dialogue, sometimes language is an integral part in his work.

His films are shaped by a **keen sense of observation** and an instinct for social disturbances, be it the murderer "next door" (LAS HORAS DEL DÍA), the missing perspectives of the younger generation in Spain (HERMOSA JUVENTUD), the social structures in a family as a multilayered micro cosmos (SUEÑO Y SILENCIO), the bombings in Madrid (LA SOLEDAD), or the ETA terror (TIRO EN LA CABEZA). His works are also defined by an infallible **sense of atmosphere** that cleverly draws the audience into the stories, and makes people deal with topics that they would rather not think about. Being overt a stylist, Jaime Rosales is always interested in exploring boundaries when telling stories on the silver screen.

SPOTLIGHT: Iris Elezi (Albania)

Iris Elezi is a real renaissance woman of contemporary European film culture. She studied film theory and criticism, anthropology, Gender Studies, and film production. She is an active film conservator, and an experienced teacher, producer, author, director, and by far one of the most passionate "emissaries" of Albanian cinema abroad.

Jurij Meden, Austrian Film Museum

Following the award winning director Yeşim Ustaoğlu from Turkey, and the successful producer Ada Solomon from Romania, CROSSING EUROPE is putting the focus of the program section SPOTLIGHT on a leading female figure in European cinema for the third time. This year the choice fell on the highly active Iris Elezi from Albania, who had already personally introduced her first feature length film BOTA (IT/AL/Kosovo 2014) to the festival audience in Linz in 2015.

After studying in the USA (a.o at the TISCH School of Arts, NYU), Iris Elezi returned to Albania, where she dedicated herself to the **Albanian cinematic heritage and its conservation** next to her work as a director, producer, screen writer, and lecturer. Twenty-seven years after the fall of the isolated Stalinist dictatorship in Albania, it is still the case that little is known about the cinema from this southern European country. As a co-founder of the initiative **The Albanian Cinema Project**, Iris Elezi is a key figure in conserving the national cinematic heritage not only in a material but also in an ideological sense. In this context, they organize e.g. film screenings, in order to sensitize the public to the filmmaking from the time of the dictatorship, that is understandably rejected by large parts of the population. Iris Elezi describes her **efforts** for a critical revaluation of the Albanian cinematic heritage, that without a doubt also plays a part in the education on cultural identity, as such: "We must free ourselves from this collective amnesia."

The film selection for her Carte Blanche is split between a historic part and current productions. Next to three feature films from the recommended director Xhanfise Keko from the 1970s, the historic program also includes a comedy blockbuster from the post-Hoxha era by one of the central figures of Albanian cinema, Dhimiter Anagnosti. The "current" program section offers an ideal introduction into the Albanian cinematic universe with the documentary by Mark Cousins that is full of facts, yet has hardly been received by an international audience. The section is complemented by two further feature films, next to BOTA by Iris Elezi, the very recent and highly successful production that was shown at multiple international festivals, NËNTOR I FTOHTË by Ismet Sijarina will be shown.

NIGHT SIGHT

For the twelfth time the film journalist and festival director Markus Keuschnigg curated the NIGHTSIGHT at CROSSING EUROPE, and once again this year this section will present five extraordinary feature films – all from the genre "fantastical film".

As a motto, the curator chose: "Dance your Fears! Dancing with fear in my eyes.", calling out to people that we should never let ourselves be brought to our knees by our fears. "This diffuse thunderstorm of fear in our hearts and minds must never be instrumentalized by the few to preserve power." The five selected films present five worlds of fear – a fight for survival in the arctic ice (ARCTIC), a dystopia shaped by terror and xenophobia (DANMARKS SØNNER), the Parisian hardcore subculture in the 1970s (UN COUTEAU DANS LE CŒUR), and the return to the seemingly peaceful life on the countryside with nature (THE HOLE IN THE GROUND, KOKO-DI KOKO-DA).

CINEMA NEXT EUROPE

The Family Issue | in cooperation with Cinema Next

In 2015, CROSSING EUROPE placed the **focus** on the **"next generation"** of European filmmakers for the first time in the section Cinema Next Europe, curated in collaboration with the newcomer initiative Cinema Next. The program was conceived as a platform for Europe-wide exchange and networking, and will have its fifth edition this year curated by Wiktoria Pelzer and Dominik Tschütscher. Once again, **discovering fresh voices** and **supporting young European film** are at the forefront of this section. In the six hand-picked films, which are subsumed under the title **The Family Issue**, young filmmakers are introduced who made documentaries as their own calling cards. The **Cinema Next Europe Club** expands this cooperation by a three-day practical module for young, interested filmmakers.

This year, Cinema Next Europe deals with the much-cited nucleus of society. The filmmakers in this section portray their own families (MEIN BRUDER KANN TANZEN), document family problems and inner-family discords (UNA PRIMAVERA), explore family secrets (UN AMOUR RÊVÉ, JE VOIS ROUGE), and show the daily life of a family (TERRA FRANCA).

OK | ELFIE SEMOTAN (AT/US)

Ever since the beginning, the OK as a center for contemporary art has been an important event partner and impulse generator for the CROSSING EUROPE film festival.

This year the gallery will participate with the solo exhibition STANDING WAITING (20017/2019), an inhouse production that acted as a precursor of the well known public format HÖHENRAUSCH. In 2007, Elfie Semotan made photographs of 24 selected vendors in shops in Linz, and presented them on two meter high light boxes. Those portrayed should not be seen as amateur (advertisement) models, but be understood as "urban people", according to the artist.

Twelve years later the OK will revive this project with twelve photographs of the STANDING, WAITING series on the occasion of the preview of the documentary ELFIE SEMOTAN, PHOTOGRAPHER at CROSSING EUROPE 2019.


